 - i. Iowa Assessment scores available and a draft of calendar for discussion.

 - i. Just shy of \$200k short
 - ii. Concern on whether starting on April 1st
 - iii. Ankeny has an ordinance that has a tornado shelter included in it, March 1st deadline for it to go into effect, would add \$500k to building costs
 - iv. Conversations with Diocesan leaders on how this impacts us and when/how to move forward
 - v. Less than 20% have returned forms for plus one campaign
 - vi. Question on rebidding and changing from design build contract to lower costs.
 - 1. We are currently committed to the design build with Story Architect.
 - 2. Unsure if we can get bids from another general contractor

 - b. However, increased parking is a selling point
 - c. Could we get a temporary variance for parking lot?

 - 1. Will have a finance update from Fr. In the next few weeks and include a lot of this information
 - 2. Has meeting with Paul Carlson about long term planning and debt load

 - i. Do we have to have a final approved budget voted on by a certain date?
 - 1. Need concerns from finance council brought back to school board
 - 2. Was a concern about the extra \$20,000 ask, but might not be a deal breaker
 - 3. Depending on a few variables, there are some increases to the budget due to increases in benefits costs, around ~4,000
 - 29 new Kindergartners, added a 5th grader, a few tours in the next few weeks

 - i. Potentially adding an art club
 - 1. Starting after Spring Break for 8 weeks
 - 2. Will talk to potential instructor about age range
 - ii. Also considering an innovators club with Innovators Academy
 - 1. Could start with a \$5/student field trip with a class
 - 2. Family night possible as well
 - iii. First Lego Club
 - 1. Could be some prohibitive costs to start it
 - 2. John Deere does offer some grants for Lego leagues
 - 3. Most of the cost of the club would be up front costs
 - 4. Potential instructor who has run a league before
 - 5. Start with a smaller group this spring. Having a parent volunteer supervising a few kids, getting kits ordered off the website on Friday mornings (7-8)
 - iv. Girls on the Run
 - 1. A little behind on getting one started, need coach to go through training
 - 2. 3-5 grade girls, 2 days a week 3:30-4:45
 - 3. Focuses on lessons on improving health and then going for a run
 - 4. At the end of the session is a 5K

- Have done something similar with a bootcamp and Kate Ledyard. Maybe have Kate do this as well
- 6. There is an additional/older program for 6-8 grade girls as well.

 - 2. Need to have a balance between clubs with low costs and some with higher costs and have options for all students
- vii. Focus on an art club (art/guidance room) and Lego club for the spring 8 weeks after spring break, before school (7:30-8) on Fridays
 - 1. Do we have a fee or ask for donations
 - 2. How do we recruit parent volunteers
